This Indenture made this 18th day of August in the Year one thousand eight hundred and twelve between Benjamin Jones and Patsy his wife of Southampton County of the one part and Joseph W Ballard of Isle of Wight County of the other party Witnesses That the said Benjamin Jones of Patsy his wife in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars to them and paid by the said Joseph W Ballard at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do
