 standing on the side of the run of flaggy run swamp aforesaid
 just below the road leading from Jerusalem to black water
 bridge thence a straight line to a white oak standing in the
 Branch thence up the branch in Harts line to a sweet gum or
 corner tree thence Harts line to Molly Drakes line thence back
 to Thomas Johnsons line to a white oak thence Johnson line to
 James Whiteheads line or rather to Sam Wallace line thence Wallace
 line to Jacob Popers line thence Popers line to a Willow oak in
