This Indenture made this eleventh day of November in the year of Christ one thousand eight hundred and twelve between William Kitching and Sally his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and Samuel Pond of said County of another part Witnesseth that the said William Kitching in order to secure the payment of a debt due unto Thomas Gray of the County aforesaid from the said Kitching on a bond dated the 23rd day of January in the year 1812 for the sum of twenty four pounds four shillings & eleven pence halfpenny which the said Kitching justly owes to the said Gray together with all the interest to grow due thereon and whereas the said Thomas Gray stands bound with the said W^m Kitching as his bail in a suit instituted in the County Court of Southampton by Nathaniel Davis of the County of Wake and State of North Carolina in a bond executed to the Sheriff of the County of Southampton aforesaid for the just sum of eighty seven pounds fifteen shillings and sixpence with the interest and costs to accrue thereon in the penalty of double the above sum. Now in order to secure the debt due unto Thomas Gray as is aforesaid with the interest to grow due thereon and to save the said Thomas Gray from all indangements or harm that can may or shall in any way or manner ensue on account of his being bail as aforesaid and for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar unto the said W^m Kitching in hand paid by the said Sam^l Pond at or before the sealing of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said Williams Kitching hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said Samuel Pond his heirs executors administrators or assigns all that tract plantation and parcel of land whereon
