To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land together with the premises, emoluments her and appurtenances and all and every of the appurtenances thereunto belonging unto him the said John Wilson Whitefield his heirs and assigns forever against the claim of them the said Reuben Whitefield & Phibe his wife do by these presents warrant and well forever defend unto him the said John Wilson Whitefield his heirs and assigns, all right title property and Interest in and to the said land &c against the claim or claims of all and every person or persons whatsoever.
