At a Court held for the county of Southampton the day of April 1813 This abstract of the last will and testament of Mary Branch dec. and a certificate of the clerk of North Carolina County State of North Carolina and his seal of office thereon affixed was presented into court and ordered to be Recorded

Southampton County to wit

Names age sex and description of certain slaves owned by Jacob Barnes of the said county of Southampton ever since the 19th day of December 1812 and removed by him on the 25th of January 1813 from the county of Hartford in the state of North Carolina when the said slaves resided into the said County of Southampton (to wit) one negro girl named Julia aged eleven years of the common complexion of slaves —
One negro boy named Dred aged three years of the common complexion of slaves —

Southampton County to wit

Jacob Barnes this day personally appeared before me William Blain a Justice of the peace for the County of Southampton and made oath that the above statement contains a true account of the names age sex and description of certain slaves owned by him in the county of Hartford in the state of North Carolina ever since the 19th day of December 1812 and removed by him on the 25th day of January 1813 from the said county of Hartford into the said county of Southampton, and moreover that the said negro girl named Julia and the said negro boy named Dred have not been brought by him into this Commonwealth to prevent the further importation of slaves or in any manner contrary to the provisions of the act of the General assembly passed on the 15th day of January last concerning slaves Given under my hand and seal this 16th day of March 1813 —
