This Indenture made this 17th day of July one thousand
eight hundred and thirteen between Lucy Long of the county
of Southampton of the one part and George Ivey of the county
of the other part witnesseth that the said Lucy Long
for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and sixty
pounds four shillings to her in hand paid by the said George
Ivey the receipt whereof the said Lucy Long doth hereby
acknowledge and thereof acquit and discharge the said
George Ivey his heirs executors and adm^r and herself
to be therewith contented satisfied and paid hath granted
bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain
sell alien enfeoff confirm set over and deliver unto
him the said George Ivey and to his heirs executors adm^r
or assigns one certain tract piece and parcel of land
situate lying and being in the county of Southampton
and parish of Saint Lukes and on the south side of the three
Creeks containing by survey eighty nine acres be the same
more or less and bounded as followeth to wit beginning at
a maple on the main run of the three Creeks in John Rivers
line thence a straight line to Nancy Rivers line thence
along said line to the land belonging to the estate of David
Thomas deceased thence along said line to a pine in John
Parkman mill pond thence down said pond to the mill
house thence down the various courses of the mill swamp
