Be it remembered That John Deneque of
the city of New York Gentleman who hath resided within the
limits and jurisdiction of the United States for the term of
five years and within this state of New York for the term of five
months at least appeared in the court of common pleas called
The mayors court and which is a common law court of
Record held in and for the city of New York in the state of
New York on Saturday the thirty first day of December
in the year one thousand eight hundred and three and having
made proof to the satisfaction of the said court that he
is a person of good moral character attached to the principles
of the constitution of the United States and well disposed to
the good order and happiness of the same and having in the
said court taken the oath prescribed by law to support
the constitution of the United States, and did in open court
absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and
fidelity to every foreign prince potentate state or sovereignty
and particularly to the french republic of which he
was then a citizen the said John Deneque was thereupon per-
suant to the laws of the United States in such case made
and provided for admitted by the said court to be and he is
accordingly to be considered a citizen of the United States

Given under the seal of the said court this
thirty first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and three -
