Laurence Myrick's Indenture made this 9th day of October in the year
to our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and thirteen
Wilson between William Laurence and Wilmouth Laurence his wife
of the county of Southampton and Parish of Nottoway of the one
part and Benjamin Wilson of the same parish and bounty
of the other part - Witnesseth that the said William Lau-
rence and Wilmouth his wife for and in consideration of the
sum of three hundred and ninety dollars, to them in hand paid
by the said Benjamin Wilson at or before the sealing and
delivery of these presents the receipt whereof they do hereby
acknowledge themselves fully and amply satisfied contented and
paid, have bargained, sold aliened and confirmed and by these
presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Benjamin
Wilson his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or
parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid parish and
County containing by estimation sixty five and a half acres
be the same more or less and bounded as followeth beginning at
a lightwood post a corner in Richard Blackshins line starting
at the side of the piney ridge road thence along a line of marks
trees to a black gum a corner tree in Benjamin Wilson
line standing in the dam branch thence down the said branch
to a black gum a corner tree of Wilsons line standing in
the long branch thence down said branch to a black gum
