This Indenture made this eighth day of November
in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred
and thirteen between Jordan Bell and Elizabeth Bell his
wife both of the county of Southampton and Parish of St. Andrew
of the one part and Henry Leno of the other part Witnesseth
that the said Jordan Bell and Elizabeth his wife for and
in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars good and
lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said
Henry Leno the receipt whereof the said Jordan Bell and
Elizabeth his wife doth acknowledge themselves to be fully
and amply satisfied and paid hath granted bargained and sold
aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant
bargain and sell unto the said Henry Leno One certain tract
or parcel of land and premises situate lying and being in the
county and parish aforesaid being a part of the plantation
whereon the said Jordan Bell now lives containing by a late
survey made by the county surveyor two hundred acres be the
same more or less and bounded as follows to wit beginning
at a bay tree standing in the long branch a new corner made
in Jacob Turners line running thence North 7 degrees West 196 poles
to a pine a new corner made in Jordan Bells line thence N
80 degrees East 28 poles to a pine a corner in Jordan Bells
line and a straight line of Samuel Jones's thence N 37
N 34 poles to a red oak a corner of Samuel Jones's thence N 37
N 42 poles thence N 84 West 47 poles thence N 84 W 22 poles
thence S 33 N 6 poles thence S 31 W 132 poles to a dead pine
a banner of John Carr Stapeney thence S 12 E 6 poles thence
S 4 N 12 poles to a small post oak a corner in John
Barstapeney's line thence S 51 degrees East 183 poles
