Whereas Robert Cocke deceased of the county of Surrey
leaved a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of
Southampton called and known by the name of Cockes's planta-
tion and whereas the said Robert Cocke died intestate leaving
and infant daughter Martha R Cocke heiress of the estate of
the said Robert Cocke and whereas the said infant Martha
since intermarried with Bartholomew P. Henry and died under
lawful age without issue and the said tract or parcel of
land returning to the heirs at law of the said Martha and
Daniel Coleman and Martha his wife being entitled to a certain
undivided proportion or interest in the said tract or parcel
of land and being desirous of selling their interest therein

This Indenture made this eighth day of
September in the year of Christ one thousand eight hundred and
thirteen between Daniel Coleman and Martha his wife of
the county of Carolina of the one part and Simon Boykin of the
county of Southampton of the other part Witnesseth that the
said Daniel Coleman and Martha his wife for and in Consider-
ation of the sum of five hundred dollars unto them in hand
paid by the said Simon Boykin at or before the sealing and
delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
have granted bargained sold aliened and conveyed and by these
presents doth grant bargain sell alien and convey unto the
said Simon Boykin all their right title and interest in being
one fifth part of the said undivided tract or parcel of land
lying in the county of Southampton of which Martha R. Henry
did die seized, to have and to hold the said right title and interest
of them the said Daniel Coleman and Martha his wife of
in or to the said undivided proportionable tract or parcel of land
