Pursuant to the within Commission directed to us two of the Justices of the peace for the county of Caroline we have this day examined the within named Martha Coleman separately and apart from her said Husband the within named Daniel Coleman who made her acknowledgments to the trust of land mentioned in the said bequests annexed and said she did the same freely and voluntarily without the persuasions or threats of her said husband and that she is willing the same should be recorded in the county court of Southampton. And at a Court held for the said county of Southampton the day of March 1814 This Indenture was further proved by the oaths of John Barger and Francis Pickley two of the Witnesses thereto and with a Commissioner for the peace sworn - Lord of Mrs. Martha Coleman and a certificate of its execution returned and ordered to be recorded.
