This Indenture made this 16th day of April in the year
of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and fourteen
between Henry Briggs administrator with the will annexed of
Samuel Calcut deceased of the county of Southampton of the
one part and Samuel Calcut of the aforesaid county of the other
part Witnesseth that the said Henry Briggs by virtue of the
power and authority vested in him by the last will and testament
of Samuel Calcut deceased which has been duly proved and
recorded in the county court of Southampton hath for and
in consideration of the sum of two hundred and thirty four
dollars and fifty two cents to him in hand paid the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged have given granted bargained
and sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents
unto the said Samuel Calcut his heirs and assigns forever
a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the county
of Southampton and bounded as will fully appear by a deed
made by Josiah Wick and wife to the said Samuel Calcut
which has been duly proved and recorded in the county court
of Southampton containing forty five and one tenth acres
to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with
all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging
unto the said Samuel Calcut his heirs and assigns forever
and the said Henry Briggs administrator as aforesaid the tract or parcel of land
