 and Sally his wife for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred
 and seven pounds Current money of Virginia to them in hand paid
 by the said Arthur Williamson the receipt whereof they the said
 James Atkinson and Sally his wife doth hereby acknowledge hath
 bargained and sold aliened and confirmed and do by these presents
 bargain sell alien and confirm unto the said Arthur Williamson
 a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the
 county of Southampton on the south side of the three weeks run
 said to contain two hundred acres be the same more or less it being
 part of a tract granted by Patent to Joseph Clark for four hundred
 acres bearing date the fifteenth day of July one thousand seven hundred
 and twenty land sold by the said Joseph Clark to James Westbrook He
 bounded as follows to wit beginning at two pines chopped inward
 corner trees in Capt. Stetsons Masons line thence down Jones line
 to a pine thence along the said line to a branch to a white oak
 a corner tree in William Willfords line thence down the said branch
 to the mouth thereof to a white oak thence along a line of marked
 trees to the mouth of the school house branch and up the said
 branch to a pine in the head of the branch thence along John
 Parkmans line to white oak and thence along the said line to David
 Westbrooks line and thence down Westbrooks line to a piney meadow
