This Indenture made the 5th day of April in the year
 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty between Thomas
 Thunt of the county of Sussex of the one part and Henry Appleswhite
 of the county of Southampton of the other part. Witnesses
 that the said Thomas Thunt for divers considerations him then
 unto moving as well as for the further consideration of one
 dollar lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid the
 receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said Thomas Thunt
 hath released and confirmed and by these presents doth release
 and confirm unto the said Henry Appleswhite his heirs and
 assigns all his the said Thomas Thunt's interest claim or demand
 in and to a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the
 county of Southampton bounded as follows beginning at the
 mouth of Robins branch as called thence up the various courses
 of the three creeks to a sweet gum corner tree of Westbrooks
 land thence along the said Henry P Westbrooks line nearly
 a south course untill it falls into Benjamin Lewis's line at
 a pine tree a corner a corner of said Westbrooks land thence
 along the said Lewis's line nearly a south course to a wellborn
 oak from thence to the beginning as so to release to the said
 Henry Appleswhite all his the said Thomas Thunt's interest claim
 or demand in the said land as the said Thomas Thunt's interest claim
 or demand may cover and which said tract of land was a part
 of the dowry estate of Priscilla Westbrook deceased. To have
 to hold in the said tract of land all the right title claim
 or demand of him the said Thomas Thunt unto the said Henry
 Appleswhite his heirs and assigns forever. In Witness
