 and we do therefore command you that you do personally
 go to the said Nancy and receive her acknowledgment
 of the same and examine her privately and apart from the said
 Joshua Patton her husband whether she doth the same freely
 and voluntarily without his persuasions or threats and whether
 she be willing that the same shall be recorded in our county
 Court of Southampton aforesaid and when you have received
 her acknowledgment and examined her as aforesaid that you
 do solemnly and faithfully certify us thereof in our said County Court
 under your seal ending thus Where this writ with the
 said indenture heretofore Witness Samuel Tills clerk
 of our said Court at his office the 20th day of September 1813
