This Indenture made this first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and thirtyn between Joel Wick and Julia Wick his wife of the county of Southampton and state of Virginia of the one part and Richard E. Williams of the same County of the other part - Witnesseth that the said Joel Wick and Julia his wife for and in consideration of the sum of fifteen pounds six shillings and eight pence, lawful money of Virginia hath given and granted and by these presents, doth give and grant unto the said Richard E. Williams a parcel of land containing sixteen and one third acres bounded thus, beginning at a red oak a corner tree of Samuel Roberts dec^d and Jacob Wickes thence south 70° E 78 poles down the horse pen branch to the foot of Faggy run and said branch thence up the various courses of Faggy run to white oak standing in said run thence south 40° West 62 poles to the first station To have and to hold the said lands and its appurtenances to the said Richard E. Williams his heirs and assigns forever - and so the only proper use and behoof of him the said Richard E. Williams his heirs and assigns He Sir Witness whereof we have set our hands and affixed our seals the day and date above written Signed Seals and delivered
