This Indenture made this twenty first day of June in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and fourty four between Richard Wick and Charlotte Wick of the county of Southampton of the one part and Panny Parker of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Richard Wick for and in the consideration of the sum of thirty two dollars and fifty Cents to him in hand paid by the said Panny Parker the receipt whereof the said Richard Wick doth hereby acknowledge he the said Richard Wick hath granted bargained and sold alien Enfeoff and confirm unto the said Panny Parker her heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land containing five acres be the same more or less situate lying and being in the county of Southampton on the north side of Pottery Run and bounded as follows - Beginning at a person named Thos in Paddy Wicks line thence a line of marked trees one hundred and forty yards to a sapling or column tree thence a line of
