 and possessed and which descended to them as the children of
 James Moore and Belia his wife now deceased and formerly
 Belia Williams sister to Isaac Williams who was father
 to the said Edwin Williams deceased known in the division
 of said tract of land by number one and bounded as follows
 beginning at the path in Richard Reeds line, running thence
 North 64° 09' 30" poles to a spring or variation in Richard Reeds
 line thence 78 West 24 poles to a maple in a small branch the
 South 66° 12' 20" poles to a dead white oak in Robert Reeds and
 field a corner of said Reeds thence N 42° E 65 1/2 poles to a red
 oak thence N 9° E 24 poles to a red oak a corner of old Cooper Williams
