Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred
and fifty two dollars and seventy five cents the receipt whereof is
hereby acknowledged by the said Harris hath granted bargained
by these presents do grant bargain sell alien and confirm unto
the said Drury and his heirs forever a certain tract or parcel of
land situate lying and being in the said County of Southampton and on the
south side of the Three Creeks and bounded as follows to wit on the
North by the said Creeks on the south by the lands of the aforesaid
Hardy Harris and on the east and West by by the other seven
eighths of the aforesaid land of William Harris deceased now
the lands of the aforesaid Humphrey Drury containing forty two
and one eighth acres (be the same more or less) with all the improv-
ments and benefits thereto belonging To have and to hold
unto the said Humphrey Drury his heirs or assigns forever notwith-
standing the said Hardy Harris do warrant and forever defend
the title of said Drury and his heirs forever against the claim of
every person whatsoever In Witness whereof the said
Hardy Harris hath hereunto set my hand and seal this day and
