This Indenture made this 29th day of September Anno Domini One thousand eight hundred and fourteen between Nathaniel Foster and Edward Foster his wife on the one part and Benjamin Lewis on the other part both of the county of Southampton and state of Virginia Witnesseth that the said Nathaniel Foster of Edward his wife for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars Virginia money to them in hand paid by the said Benjamin Lewis at and before the sealing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed unto the said Benjamin Lewis his heirs assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of land situated lying and being in the aforesaid county of Southampton and state of Virginia and bounded as follows - beginning at a parcel of black oak posts a corner in the said Lewis line also a corner of the land that was formerly Thomas Westbrook &c. which the said Foster buys by marriage thence along the said Benjamin Lewis line nearly a south west course to a pine an Elbow in said Lewis's line thence along the said Lewis's line to a corner red oak in the land that the said Lewis purchased of Rebecca Tilar thence along the said line that was formerly Rebecca Tilar nearly an east course to an oak and maple standing together in a prong of the flat branch nearly a place called Jimmy's Rice patch thence a straight line to the beginning containing forty acres be the same more or less To have and to hold the forty acres with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging to the said Benjamin Lewis his heirs and assigns forever
