This Indenture made this 28<sup>th</sup> day of November one thousand eight hundred and fourteenth between Benjamin W. Johnson of King  
County and state of Virginia of the first part William Amis of  
Southampton County and state of North Carolina of the second part  
and James Jackson of Southampton County aforesaid of the third part  
Witnesseth that Whereas the said Benjamin W. Johnson stands party  
to the sum of two thousand dollars or demand the 25<sup>th</sup> day of Decem-  
ber one thousand eight hundred and fifteen - and whereas the  
said Benjamin W. Johnson is willing and desirous of securing  
the payment of the aforesaid debt to him the said William Amis  
and to his heirs and assigns forever - Now These Indentures  
witnesseth that the said Benjamin W. Johnson hath for and in  
consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the  
said James Jackson hath granted bargained and sold and by these  
Presents doth grant bargain and sell unto him the said James  
Jackson and to his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or  
parcel of land situated and lying in the county of Southampton  
aforesaid abutting the same tract which the said Benjamin  
W. Johnson purchased of Doctor Newson and lying directly on  
Meherin river immediately at Stileys Bridge containing by  
survey two hundred and six and a half acres be the same more  
or less - Upon this special trust and confidence that is to say that  
the said Benjamin W. Johnson shall pay to the said W. Amis  
his heirs or assigns the before mentioned debt on or before the 25<sup>th</sup> day  
December one thousand eight hundred and fifteen - that then and in  
that case - the said James Jackson may and shall at any time hereafter  
when requested either by the said W. Amis or B. W. Johnson by giving  
one months public notice of the same, sell at public sale for ready  
money all or as much of the said tract of land and premises as will  
be sufficient value to pay and satisfy the aforesaid debt interest  
and cost of sale and out of such sale pay to the said W. Amis his  
heirs or assigns the amount of his debt aforesaid and the said Benj.  
W. Johnson doth for himself his heirs executors adm<sup>t</sup>s and every other  
Person whatsoever warrant to the said James Jackson the title
