This Indenture made this 28th day of November in the
 Year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and fourteen between
 Matthew Brilt and wife Elizabeth of the county of Southampton
 of the one part and David Writter of the county of Sussex of the other
 part - Witnesseth that the said Matthew Brilt and wife Eliza-
 beth for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dol-
 lars to them in hand paid at or before the executing and delivery of
 these presents the receipt whereof they doth hereby acknowledge
 hath granted sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth
 grant bargain and sell, alien and confirm unto the said David
 Writter his heirs and assigns forever an certain tract or piece
 of land that I obtained of and agreeable to my father's will) situated
 lying and beginning at a mulberry tree on the road side adjoining
 Joseph Brilt line and thence along a line of marked trees to
 Robert Horns line and thence the said Horns line to a red oak
 and then along a line of marked trees adjoining Benjamin Brilt to the
