Jones and Eliza Lewis two of the witnesses thereto in presence
of an act of assembly in such case or cases and provided and is
continued for further proof - And at a Court held for the said
County of Southampton the 29th day of February 1815 This Indenture
was countersigned and in the Clerk's office April 12th 1815 This
Indenture was acknowledged by Sir Williams party hereto and
admitted to record - And at a Court held for the said County of
Southampton the 19th day of April 1815 This Indenture as
aforesaid were entered upon the proceedings of the day -

This Indenture made this 9th day of October in the year
of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and fourteen between
Henry Jones and Elizabeth Jones his wife both of the County of Hampton
and Parish of Rottenay of the one part and James Jones of the same
County and Parish of the other part (Notattuck) that the said
Henry Jones and Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration of the
sum of four hundred and fifty dollars good and lawful money to
them in hand paid by the said James Jones the receipt whereof the said
Henry Jones and Elizabeth his wife doth acknowledge themselves fully
and amply satisfied and paid hath granted bargained sold alienated
enfeoffed and confirmed by these presents doth grant bargain and
all alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said James Jones to hold and
to his heirs forever - One certain tract or parcel of land of promise
together with all the appurtenances therefrom wherein the said Henry
Jones now lives containing by estimation one hundred and eighteen
acres the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit beginning
at a small sweet gum standing on the side of road that leads from
Blackwater Bridge to Jerusalem, thence along the side part of
the road to Joseph Denson's line thence along Denson's line to a
pine standing in the low branch in James Jones's other line
thence down the various courses of the river of the said branch to
where David Whiting's and James Jones's line intersects each
