This Indenture was proved by the oaths of James Jones and Eliza Lewis two of the witnesses thereto in pursuance of an act of assembly in such case made and provided and is continued for further proof - And at a court held for the said County of Southampton the day of February 1815 This Indenture was continued - and in the Clerk's office April 15th 1815 This Indenture was acknowledged by Thos Williams personally and admitted to record - And at a court held for the said County of Southampton the 17th day of April 1815 This Indenture and aforesaid were entered upon the proceedings of the day -

This Indenture made this 9th day of October in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and fourteen between Henry Jones and Elizabeth Jones his wife both of the County of Hampton and Parish of Nettoway of the one part and James Jones of the same County and Parish of the other part (Witnesseth) that the said Henry Jones and Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred and thirty dollars good and lawful money to them in hand paid by the said James Jones the receipt whereof the said Henry Jones and Elizabeth his wife doth acknowledge themselves fully and amply satisfied and paid hath granted bargained sold conveyed and confirmed and confirmed by these presents doth grant bargain and sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said James Jones his heirs and to his heirs forever - One certain tract or parcel of land of Pennsylvania together with all the appurtenances thereof whereon the said Henry Jones now lives containing by estimation one hundred and eighteen acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows (to wit) beginning at a small sweet gum standing on the side of road that leads from Black water bridge to Jerusalem, thence along the side of road of the road to Joseph Denson's line thence along Denson's line to a pine standing in the low branch in James Jones's other line thence down the various courses of the run of the said branch to where David Whitby's and James Jones's lines intersect to a creek
