Mossard to Milliken This indenture made this 20th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen between Elizabeth Woodard widow and heir of William Woodard deceased and Sally Woodard Davis Woodard Charles Woodard William Woodard John Woodard Elizabeth Woodard and Lucy Woodard infant heirs of the said William Woodard deceased by their next friend John Rechelle appointed by the County Court of Southampton to perform certain things enjoined upon him by a decree of the said Court of the one part and James Milliken of the other part all of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia witnesseth that previous to the death of the said William Woodard a verbal agreement was made and entered into between the said William Woodard and James Milliken to exchange with each other their tract of land lying in this County - The tract of land of which the said Woodard was then seized and which was to be conveyed to the said Milliken in exchange for his tract containing Nineteen $\frac{3}{4}$ acres being the same tract which the said Woodard had ^{but} purchased of a certain Josiah Vick and lying contiguous to the town of Jerusalem and the tract of land of which the said Milliken was then seized and which was to be conveyed to the said Woodard in exchange for his tract containing two hundred and eighty acres being the same tract of land which the said Milliken had ^{but} purchased of a certain Lewis P. Hart and wife that the said Woodard agreed to pay the said James the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars provided the said Milliken receive a lease of the said Woodard at the price of one pound
