This Indenture made this 20th day of April another
eight hundred and fifteen between Elizabeth Morward and our
heir of William Morward deceased and Sally Morward Davis
Morward Charles Morward William Morward John Morward
Elizabeth Morward and Amey Morward Infant heirs of the said
William Morward deceased by their next friend John K. Schell
appointed by the County Court of Southampton to perform certain
things enjoined upon him by a decree of the said Court of the
one part and James Mellikin of the other part all of the County
of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesses that previous
to the death of the said William Morward a verbal agree-
ment was made and entered into between the said William Morward
and James Mellikin to exchange with each other their tracts of
land lying in this County. The tract of land of which the said
Morward was then seized and which was to be conveyed to the said
Mellikin in exchange for his tract containing Ninety four
acres being the same tract which the said Morward had previously
purchased of a certain Josiah Wick and lying contiguous to the
town of Jerusalem and the tract of land of which the said Mellikin
was then seized and which was to be conveyed to the said Morward
in exchange for his tract containing two hundred and eighty acres
being the same tract of land which the said Mellikin had
previously purchased of a certain Lewis D. Hart and wife and
the said Morward agreed to pay the said James the sum of
two hundred and fifty dollars provided the said Mellikin should
Receive a horse of the said Morward at the price of one hundred
