affirmed and entered upon the proceedings of the day

This Indenture made this 2nd day of November
1814 between Robert Johnson of the County of Southampton of
the one part and John Luster of the second County of the other part
Witnesseth that the said Robert Johnson for and in consideration
of the full and just sum of thirty dollars and fifty cents good and
lawful money of Virginia he here in hand paid by the said John
Luster the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge myself fully
and amply satisfied and paid hath granted bargained and sold alienated
released and confirmed and by the presents doth grant bargain
and sell unto the said John Luster his heirs and assigns forever
all that plantation tract or parcel of land and premises with the
appurtenances now in the tenure and occupation of the said John
Luster situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton
Containing thirty acres be the same more or less and bounded as
follows Beginning at a Turkey oak standing in John Luster's line
a corner then there is along a line of marked trees to a lightwood
