Southampton by his last will and testament bearing date  
the seventh day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred  
and nine devised the use of a certain Part of his lands which  
is described in his last will and which is of record in the County of  
Southampton aforesaid together with his still Grist mill and  
the property thereon mentioned, reference being had to the  
will aforesaid will fully appear to his wife Cathar. Pond during  
her natural life or widowhood and afterwards to his four daughters  
Sally Rochester, Temperance Ann and Betsy and whereas the said  
Betsy hath since intermarried with Edwin Hicks of the County  
of Suffolk and the said Edwin Hicks and Betsy his wife having  
by a deed of Conveyance sold and annexed all their right title  
and Interest of or to the land and property as it before menti-  
oned unto Rebecca Nasworthy late Rochester Pond one of the  
divisors of the will of the said John Pond Senr deceased  
and the said Rebecca Nasworthy being desirous of saving  
Thomas Gray from any damage or loss he might sustain
