Whereas John Pond Sen^r died: late of the County of Southampton by his last will and testament bearing date the seventh day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and nine devised the use of a certain part of his lands which are described in his last will and which is of record in the County of Southampton aforesaid together with his stile Grot. mill and the property therein mentioned, reference being had to the will aforesaid will fully appear to his wife, Belah Pond during her natural life or widowhood and afterwards to his four daughters Sally Ribickah, Tempey Ann and Betsey and whereas the said Betsey hath since intermarried with Edwin Hicks of the County of Sussex and the said Edwin Hicks and Betsey his wife having by a deed of Conveyance sold and conveyed all their right title and Interest of in or to the land and property as is before mentioned unto Rebecca Annworthy late Rebecca Pond one of the devisees of the will of the said John Pond Sen^r deceased and the said Rebecca Annworthy being desirous of saving Thomas Gray from any damage for Loss he might sustain
