This Indenture made this tenth day of June in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen between Joseph Joyner of the County of Southampton of the one part and Nancy Joyner of the same County of the other part - Witnesseth that the said Joseph Joyner for and in Consideration of his having this day received of the said Nancy Joyner a negro man slave by the name of Luke which the said Nancy Joyner hath by and bearing several state with this Indenture conveyed to the said Joseph Joyner for and during the term of his natural life remission of Wm B Joyner and Francis Joyner daughters of the said Joseph Joyner hath granted bargained sold released confirmed given acquiesced claim and by these presents doth grant bargain sell release confirm and forever quit claim unto the said Nancy Joyner her heirs and assigns forever the following slaves to wit Anthony Dianah Sub Charles
