whatsoever claiming by through or under him shall will and
doth hereby forever warrant and defend by then presents -

Anne domini one thousand eight hundred and fifteen between
Benjamin Sells of the County of Southampton state of Virginia
of the one part and Kinchen Sells of the same county and state
of the other parts Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Sells
for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred sixty seven
dollars and seventy five Cents to me in hand paid by the said Kinchen
Sells the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said Benjⁿ
Sells have bargain granted and sold and by their presents
do fully bargain grant and sell unto the said Kinchen Sells
his heirs and his heirs forever one certain tract or piece of land situate
lying and being in the County of Southampton state of Virginia
