This Indenture made this Tenth day of July
in the year of our Lord One Thousand eight hundred
and fifteenth between John Freeman of the first part
James Rockwell of the second part and Benjamin
Barham (of being) of the third part Witnesses
that whereas the said John Freeman stands justly
indebted to Spratly Williams sum of Obligor of himself
Pittsburgh and in the sum of Seventy seven Dollars
and Sixty four Cents as will appear by bond
equal date with these presents executed in the clerk
office by the said John Freeman, and the said
Benjamin Barham have become this security
for the same, agreeable to an act of assembly
concerning executions, and for other purposes
and the said John Freeman being willing and desirous
to secure the said Benjamin Barham. Now this
Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration
of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said James
Rockwell, at and before the sealing and delivery of
these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
the said John Freeman hath given, granted,
bargained, and sold, and by these presents doth
give, grant, bargain, and sell to the said James
Rockwell, his heirs, and assigns forever, One Bay
More and one Sorell more, one bed and furniture
to have and to hold the ^{fore} said property to the said
James Rockwell, his heirs Executors or assigns forever
In Test. Now the life and upon these express conditions
that if the said John Freeman his heirs Executors or assigns
shall truly pay unto cause to be paid unto the
said Spratly Williams his heirs or assigns the sum
of Seventy seven Dollars and Sixty four Cents
and interest thereon agreeable to the tenor of said
bond then the said James Rockwell together with
aforesaid shall execute a proper release for the
aforesaid property hereby conveyed. But it is agreed
by the parties, and it is declared to be the true
and meaning of the parties to these presents, and
