His Indenture made this tenth day of July
in the year of our Lord One Thousand eight hundred
and fifteen between John Freeman of the first part
James Rochelle of the second part and Benjamin
Barham (of Barj.) of the third part witnesseth
that whereas the said John Freeman stands justly
indebted to Pratty Williams and Oliver of himself
Pittsburgh and in the sum of Twenty seven Dollars
and Sixty four Cents as will appear by bond
equal date with these presents executed in the above
Office by the said John Freeman and the said
Benjamin Barham have become this security
for the same, agreeable to an act of Assembly
concerning executions, and for other purposes
and the said John Freeman being willing and desirous
to secure the said Benjamin Barham Now this
Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration
of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said James
Rochelle at and before the sealing and delivery of
these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
that the said John Freeman hath given, granted,
Bargained, and sold, and by these presents doth
give, grant, bargain, and sell to the said James
Rochelle, his heirs, and assigns forever, one Bay
Mare and one Sorrel Mare, one Bed and furniture
to have and to hold the said property to the said
James Rochelle, his heirs exec^t or assigns forever
in trust, nevertheless and upon these express conditions
that if the said John Freeman his heirs exec^t or assigns
shall truly pay unto cause to be paid unto the
said Pratty Williams his heirs or assigns the sum
of Twenty seven Dollars and Sixty four Cents
and interest thereon agreeable to the terms of the
bond then the said James Rochelle trustee
aforesaid shall execute a proper release for
the said property hereby conveyed But it is agreed
by the parties, and it is declared to be the true intent
and meaning of the parties to these presents, and
