

Southampton County: The Commonwealth of Virginia
 to John Turnbull, Hartwell Vick, and William Lewis
 Justices of the peace for the County of Warren Mississippi
 Territory greeting whereas Newell Vick and Elizabeth Vick
 his wife by their certain and intire bargain and sale
 bearing date the seventeenth day of August 1814
 have sold and conveyed unto William Barnes of the
 County of Southampton and state of Virginia one messuage
 one plantation and tract of land containing by estimation
 one hundred acres of land with the appurtenances lying
 being in the county of Southampton and whereas the said
 Elizabeth cannot conveniently travel to our County Court of
 Southampton to make acknowledgment of the said conveyance
 therefore we do give to you or any two or more of you power
 to receive the acknowledgment which the said Elizabeth shall
 be willing to make before you of the conveyance aforesaid
 contained in the said indenture which is thereto annexed
 and we do therefore command you that you do personally
 go to the said Elizabeth and receive her acknowledgment
 of the same and examine her privately and apart from
 from the said Newell Vick her husband and whether she doth
 the same freely and voluntarily without any persuasion or
 threats and whether she be willing that the same shall be
 recorded in our County Court of Southampton aforesaid and
 when you have received her acknowledgment and examined her
 as aforesaid that you distinctly and openly certify us thereof
 in our said County Court under your seal, sending thereto
 the said indenture and this writ. Witnesses Samuel Wells
