

This Indenture made this twentye of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen between James Whitehead of Robertson County unto state of Tennessee by John Gardner his attorney in fact of the one part and Henry Bishop of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the other part witnesseth that the said James Whitehead by the said John Gardner his attorney in fact for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars to him the said attorney in hand paid by the said Henry Bishop at and before the making and delivery of these presents therewithal is hereby acknowledged by the said James Whitehead by the said John Gardner his attorney hath granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed unto by these presents doth grant bargaine sell alien and confirm unto the said Henry Bishop his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract piece or parcel of land lying in the aforesaid County of Southampton on the west side of Notley river in the containing by estimation

ninetynight acres be the same more or less together the following boundaries Viz Beginning at a old oak in Samuel Magettis line running thence along said Magettis line to the corner of lot of land assigned to James Whitehead there along said Whiteheads line to Williams Allens line there along said Allens line to a corner of the lot assigned to Elizabeth Whitehead which lot is now in possession of said Henry Bishop under a purchase from Thomas Hosier thence the line of the said lot to the begining - It being all that lot or parcel of land which was granted to the said James Whitehead as his portion of the lands of which his father the late Arthur Whitehead did enjoy and possess - To have and to hold the said tract piece or parcel of land together with all and singular the goods fayrely appurtenances and emmoluments of all and every kind whatsoever to the same belonging or from or out of the same in any manner arising or pertaining to them the said Henry Bishop his heirs & assigns forever - And he the said James Whitehead by the said John Gardner his attorney for himself his heirs executors and administrators doth hereby warrant and will forever
