

This Indenture

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made this eighteenth of July in the
 year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen between
 James Whitehead of Robertson County and state of Tennessee
 by John Casner his attorney in fact of the one part and Henry
 Bishop of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of
 the other part Witnesseth that the said James Whitehead by the
 said John Casner his attorney in fact for and in consideration
 of the sum of four hundred dollars to him the said attorney
 in hand paid by the said Henry Bishop at and before the making
 and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged by the said James Whitehead by the said John
 Casner his attorney hath granted bargained sold aliened
 and confirmed unto the said Henry Bishop his heirs and assigns
 forever a certain tract piece or parcel of land lying in the
 aforesaid County of Southampton on the west side of Nottingham
 river on one of the ^{containing by notation}
 ninety eight acres be the same more or less within the following
 boundaries viz: beginning at a red oak in Samuel Magette's line
 running thence along said Magette's line to the corner of plot of
 land assigned to Aaron Whitehead thence along said Whitehead's
 line to William Allen's line thence along said Allen's line to a
 gum a corner of the lot assigned to Elizabeth Whitehead which
 lot is now in possession of said Henry Bishop under a
 purchase from Thomas Stone thence the line of the said lot to the
 beginning - It being all that lot or parcel of land which was
 assigned to the said James Whitehead as his portions of the lands
 of which his father the late Arthur Whitehead died seized
 and possessed - To have and to hold the said tract piece or
 parcel of land together with all and singular the shares of profits
 appurtenances and emoluments of all and every kind whatsoever
 to the same belonging or from or out of the same in any manner
 arising or hereafter to him the said Henry Bishop his heirs &
 assigns forever - And to the said James Whitehead by the
 said John Casner his attorney for himself his heirs executors
 and administrators doth fully warrant and well forever
