This Indenture made this 1st day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and fourteen between Jeremiah Johnson and Lucretia Johnson his wife of Southampton County Virginia of the one part and Humphrey Drewry of said County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Jeremiah Johnson and Lucretia his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and thirty dollars to them in hand paid by the said Humphrey Drewry the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath given granted bargained sold confirmed and made over and by their presents doth give grant bargain sell confirm and make over unto the said Humphrey Drewry his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land which lies to the said Jeremiah Johnson and Lucretia his wife by the division of the lands that belongs to the estate of John Johnson deceased situated lying and being in the County of Southampton of said state and sheweth as follows beginning at a gum standing in the cedar marsh thence along said Johnsons line to a shot standing on said Drewrys line and thence along said Drewrys line to a white oak standing on Thomas Chapels line to corner thence along said Chapels line to a Pecanum standing in the said marsh thence up the said marsh to the beginning containing thirty nine acres be more or less To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with all the appurtenances thereof unto the said Humphrey Drewry his heirs and assigns forever together with all the rights privileges thereunto belonging and the said Jeremiah Johnson and Lucretia his wife doth for themselves and their heirs covenants and agrees with the said Humphrey Drewry his heirs and assigns to warrant and defend the said land unto the said Humphrey Drewry his heirs and assigns forever In Witness whereof they have hereunto set their hands and seals this 1st day of April above written -
