

At a Court held for the county of Southampton the 15th day of August 1814 This Indenture was proved by the oaths of Thomas Reely and Joseph T. Harris, two of the justices thereof, and continued - April 1st 1814 This Indenture and the Certificate of a Justice of the Peace and Thomas Reely, magistrates of this County certifying the acknowledgment of Elizabeth Johnson party hereto in pursuance of an act of assembly in such case made and proved, and admitted to record as to her August 27th 1815 This Indenture was fully proved in the Clerk's office by the oaths of a Justice of the Peace and the other witnesses thereof, and admitted to record as to her And at a court held for the said County of Southampton the 18th day of Sept. 1815 This Indenture and Certificate as aforesaid were entered upon the proceedings of the day - West B. Rochelle

This Indenture made this 14th day of July Anno domini one thousand eight hundred and fifteen Between Thomas Collier and Nancy his wife formerly Nancy Applegate of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the one part and Humphrey Drury of said County and state of the other part Witnesseth that the said Thomas Collier and Nancy his wife formerly Nancy Applegate for and in consideration of the sum of ninety eight dollars & seventy five cents current money of Virginia the then in hand paid by the said Drury at or before the sealing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge and thereof and from every part thereof do acquit and discharge the said Humphrey Drury have granted, sold, conveyed, confirmed and confirmed and by these presents do and each of them doth grant bargain sell alien in fee simple and confirm to the said Humphrey Drury his heirs and assigns with their the said Thomas Collier and Nancy his wife right title interest claim property or demand what they or either of them have in or certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and on the South side of the River York and is bounded as follows to wit beginning at a pine or Oak
