sum of two hundred and eighty dollars current money of Virginia
to them in hand paid by the said James Johnson the receipt whereof
the said William Worrell and Silviah his wife Cary Worrell and
Sarah his wife and Edith Councill doth acknowledge themselves
satisfactorily paid and doth grant bargains sell and deliver and
confirm unto the said James Johnson his heirs for a certain tract
