Fifty 1820

This Indenture made this 20th day of April one thousand eight hundred and fifteen between James Mellkin and John R. Woodard his wife of the one part and Sally Woodard daughter of Charles Woodard and William Woodard John Woodard Elizabeth Woodard and Amy Woodard heirs of William Woodard deceased of the other part all of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia witnesseth that previous to the death of the said William Woodard a verbal agreement was entered into between the said William Woodard and James Mellkin to exchange with each other their tracts of land lying in this County - The tract of land of which the said Woodard was then seized and which was to be conveyed to the said Mellkin in exchange for his tract containing hundred and three acres lying the same tract which the said Woodard had theretofore purchased of a certain Sarah Nick and lying contiguous to the town of Swains and the tract land of which the said Mellkin was then seized and which was to be conveyed to the said Woodard in exchange for his tract containing ten hundred and eighty acres being the same tract of land which the said Mellkin had theretofore purchased of a certain Lewis B. Hart that the said Woodard agreed to pay to the said Mellkin the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars provided the said Mellkin would receive a horse of the said Woodard at the price of One hundred and fifty dollars as the difference in the value of the two tracts of land which the said Mellkin agreed to do and with a view of the faithful performance of this agreement they verbally entered into between the said Mellkin and Woodard they mutually put each other into possession of the tracts of land as aforesaid agreed to be exchanged and the said Woodard actually delivered to the said Mellkin the horse which he was to receive at the price aforesaid & in further execution of the agreement aforesaid the said Woodard paid to the said Mellkin the sum of thirty seven dollars and twenty five cents leaving a balance of sixty two dollars and twenty five cents only due to the said Mellkin on account of the two hundred and fifty dollars to be paid as the difference in the value of the said land and the agreement between
