This Indenture made this 16th day of October in the year
of Christ 1815 between Adolphus Whitchard of the County of
Southampton of the one part and William Story of the County of
Southampton of the other part witnesseth that the said Adolphus
Whitchard for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and
fifty dollars current money of Virginia to him by the said Wm.
Story in hand paid the receipt whereof the said Whitchard doth
hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained sold and conveyed
and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey unto
the said William Story his heirs and assigns a certain lot or parcel
of land containing thirty seven acres and a half an acre in the
same more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton
which I inherited from my deceased father John Whitchard and
was allotted and assigned unto me by the Commissioners duly appointed
by the County Court of Southampton (at December and 1814)
to make a division of a certain tract or parcel of land which he
designed and proposed which will more fully appear appearing
to both lots No 6 in the said Commissioners report subsequently
at February Court 1815 which was admitted to record and bounded
as follows to wit beginning at a corner in lot No 4 5 and 6
