This Indenture and the Certificate of W. B. Goodwyn and Benjamin Devany magistrates of the County attesting the acknowledgment of James Mallett and Martha A. his wife parties hereto in pursuance of an act of assembly in such cases made due process and admitted to record. And at a Court held for the said County of Southampton the day of November 1815 This Indenture and Certificate as aforesaid were entered upon the proceedings of the day. Witness James Rochelle Cl.

This Indenture made this 16th day of October in the year of Christ 1815 between Adolphus Whitehead of the County of Southampton of the one part and William Story of the County of Southampton of the other part Witnesseth that the said Adolphus Whitehead for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars current money of Virginia to him by the said W. Story in hand paid the receipt whereof the said Whitehead doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained sold and conveyed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey unto the said William Story his heirs and assigns a certain lot or parcel of land containing thirty seven acres and an half or thereabouts more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton which I inherited from my deceased father John Whitehead and was allotted and assigned unto me by the Commissioners duly appointed by the County Court of Southampton (at December Court 1814) to make a division of a certain tract or parcel of land which the said sized and surveyed which will more fully appear reference being had to the lot No 6 in the said Commissioners report duly returned at February Court 1815 which was admitted to record and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a corner in lots No 4, 5 and 6
