This Indenture made this 15th day of November in the year of
 our lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen between James P. Hart
 and Mary his wife of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia
 of the one part and James Mellick of the same County and state of
 the other part Witnesseth that the said James P. Hart and Mary his
 wife hath for and in consideration of the sum of nine hundred dollars
 granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain
 sell also convey and confirm unto the said James Mellick his
 heirs and assigns the following tract of land to wit one tract containing
 by estimation one hundred and four acres be the same more or less and
 bounded as follows to wit beginning at a black gum or cypress tree on the
 white rock branch there is in on a bush well known to a pine a corner
 tree a dividing line George Washington son of George and said tract
 thence bounding on Joseph Washington line to a big silvered stump
 a corner tree thence bounding on George Washington of Mathews
