on 25th 1815 This Indenture was proved by the oaths of James Dillard and
Anthony Evans two of the witnesses thereto and admitted to Record in pursuance
of an Act of Assembly in such cases made and provided And at a

This Indenture and Certificate as aforesaid were entered upon the record

This Indenture made and entered into this 15th day of March
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen between
Samuel M. Jenkins and Betsey his wife of Suffolk County Henry D.
Inman and Rebekah his wife of Southampton Henry Jenkins
and Gray Jenkins of the one part and William Jenkins of the
other part witnesseth that the said Samuel M. Jenkins and Betsey
his wife Henry D. Inman and Rebekah his wife Henry Jenkins
and Gray Jenkins hath freely and in consideration of the sum of two
hundred and sixty dollars to them in hand paid by the said William
Jenkins the receipt whereof they the said Samuel Jenkins and
^{they do hereby acknowledge} Betsey his wife Henry D. Inman and Rebekah his wife Henry Jenkins
and Gray Jenkins hath greatly bargained and sold and by these
presentes doth grant bargain and sell the following parcels of
land to wit twenty seven and a quarter acres lying and being in the
County of Southampton and on the east ^{side of the road leading} from Allen's Bridge to Smithfield and apart of that tract on
which John and Jenkins formerly lies on Tares swamp
bound on the east by the lands belonging to the estate
