Southampton County This Indenture and the last of Thomas Dibly and Francis Dibly magistrates of this County testifying the acknowledgment of Martha Miller party here in pursuance of an act of assembly in such cases made and provided and as matters in view as to her and as the Clerk's office November the 10th 1815 This Indenture was proved by the oath of James Plant and James C. Foster one of the witnesses here and as matters in view as to her and as the Clerk's office December 15th 1815 This Indenture was fully proved by the oath of James Miller the other witness here and as matters in view as to her and as the Clerk's office the 17th day of June 1816 This Indenture is of record as entered upon the records of the day — — — James Nicholls

This Indenture made the first day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifteen between Nathaniel Boush and Sarah Elizabeth his wife of the one part of the County of Southampton and James Miller of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Nathaniel Boush and Sarah Elizabeth his wife for and in Consideration of the sum of three thousand dollars to them in hand paid by the said James Miller at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof they the said Nathaniel Boush and Sarah Elizabeth his wife doth hereby acknowledge and they acquit and discharge the said James Miller his heirs executors and administrators forever by these presents they the said Nathaniel Boush and Sarah Elizabeth his wife have granted bargained and sold aliened released and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien release and confirm unto the said James Miller his heirs and assigns forever one plantation place or tract of land situated lying and being in the fork of Bushy Swamp being the land that formerly belonged to John Fort and doth give to his heirs was purchased by Lewis Fort from of him by Nathaniel Boush — — —
