Sarah Elizabeth the wife of Nathaniel Bouch parties to a con-
tract for the conveyance of tract-estate to James Mellow bearing
date on the first day of November 1815 and who appeared personally
before us in our County aforesaid and being examined
by us privately and apart from her husband and having
this day aforesaid fully explained to her she the said Sarah Elizabeth
acknowledged the same to be her act and deed and declared that
she had willingly signed sealed and delivered the same and that
she wishes not to retract it — Given under our hands and
Seals the fourth day of November 1815 *Thos Bishley*
