

This Indenture made this sixth day of May in thousand eight hundred and fifteen between William Fowler Clerk of the Peace and Stephen Munday Commissioners appointed by the Court of Southampton County in March term 1815 of the one part and Joseph Munday of the other part Witnesseth that we the said Commissioners have this day above written and signed to the aforesaid demand for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars by the said Joseph Munday to us in hand paid for the aforesaid lands whereof Elias Oracy did seize and possessed or containing fifty acres more or less to the said Joseph Munday his heirs and assigns forever and assigns forever In testimony whereof in the presence of some witnesses have hereunto set our hands and affix our seals this day and year above written

This Indenture made this tenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen between Nancy Spino of the County of Southampton of the one part and Joseph Spino of the other part of the same County Witnesseth that the said Nancy Spino for and in consideration of the said Joseph Spino having by his said bearing square acts with these presents confirmed to her and her heirs and assigns her title to the following slaves Anthony Diana Val Joseph and Maria and their future increase claimed to her in the last will and testament of her deceased father Abraham Spino late of Southampton County (which said last will and testament bears date in the year eighteen hundred and thirteen and hath been duly admitted to record in the County Court of Southampton) and of the said Joseph Spino having released and quieted claim to the slaves aforesaid and their future increase against the claim or claims of himself his heirs and of all and every person claiming by through or under
