has his self and assigns are thereby acquitted and discharged

have bargained and sold and doth by this Indenture bargain

sell and convey unto the said James Johnson and his heirs

executors or assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land

and being sit in the County of Southampton and state of Virginia and

containing by estimation one hundred and seventy acres in the

same more or less and bounded as follows Vizt. beginning at a

point out a corner tree between Heber Summerville and John the

third of the said land lying from Black water Prays to

Joseph Vicks to a point a corner tree between said Summerville

and said plantation thence a line of marked trees to a point
