Sixth one other bond of the same date executed to James Woodward in the penalty of one hundred and twenty dollars and seventy four cents to be discharged by the payment of four hundred and sixty five dollars and thirty seven cents for the payment of which said several bonds the said Thomas Gray stands bound as security with and for the said Edwin Gray Junr. with the interest and costs to accrue thereon as also to secure the payment of a bond executed of William Hines bearing date the eighteenth day of February one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine in the penalty of Twelve hundred and one pounds four shillings and two pence conditioned for the payment of seven hundred pounds twelve shillings and one penny on or before the first day of January one thousand eight hundred with the interest and costs which may or shall accrue thereon for which the said bond the said Thomas Gray stands bound with the said Edwin Gray Junr. now in order to secure the said Thomas Gray from any damage or injury he might or may sustain in consequence of the nonpayment of the money due himself as is aforementioned or in consequence of any damage or injury he may or might sustain in either of the cases before mentioned as being bound with the said Edwin Gray Junr. and in the further consideration of the sum of one dollar unto the said Edwin Gray Junr. in hand paid by the said Edwin Gray Junr. at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Edwin Gray Junr. hath granted bargained sold aliened released and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien release and confirm unto the said Edwin Gray Junr. his heirs executors &c. &c. &c. assigns the following Negro slaves and personal property to wit Negro Dick Anthony and Frank one waggon and four mules three Horses twenty cattle yoke of oxen one ox cart and wheels two pair of Cart wheels one carriage and harness and gear and harness one hundred barrels of corn two thousand five hundred pounds of bacon one wheat fan one Corn Sheller one Iron Corn Mill two straw cutting machines ten horse plowshares tools and utensils of every kind thirty pounds of leather two hundred pounds seed cotton sixty hogs sows and piglets ten barrels Cyder 150 Lard a parcel of plank and scantling four brassy stills Morom and Tubs one apple mill 20 Lbs stands ten sixty Gallons Casks five beds Bedsteads fillers bolsters sheets and blankets twelve walnut Chairs 12 Windsor Chairs one Thermometer one map one brass Mortar and Copper Kettle six Iron Pots one tea Kettle two sets of iron and shovels one pair brass and Iron trowel pair Iron and Irons two discharging glasses one China bowl five dozen plates one dozen dishes two dozen knives and forks three walnut Tables one walnut stand one crop Cart saw six axes two hand saws two sythes and axes ten reaps Hooks two Chains three and Irons two dozen cups and saucers four water one case & bottles one pair Shovel and one hundred weight of Soap one set of garden tools a parcel of old Irons one bathing tub one Gun three hundred Volumes of Books and all other articles of personal property now on the plantation whereon the said Edwin Gray now resides
