 and admission of an act of assembly in such case made and provided and admitted to record
 at a Court held for the said County of Southampton the 15th day
 of April 1816 This Indenture and certificate as aforesaid were entered upon
 the proceedings of the day -

This Indenture made this 18th March one thousand eight
 hundred and sixteen between Henry Lundy for William Taylor of
 the County of Hancock and State of Georgia and Humphrey
 Drury of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the
 other part Witnesseth that the said Henry Lundy for and in consideration
 of the sum of two hundred and seventy two dollars and fifty cents
 to him in hand paid by the said Humphrey Drury at and before the
 signing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged and given every part or parcel thereof is hereby
 discharged unto the said Humphrey Drury have granted bargained
 sold and confirmed and by these presents with bargain sell and
 confirm unto the said Humphrey Drury his heirs and assigns all
 the right and title interest claim property or demand which W. Taylor
 has to a certain tract of land and its appurtenances lying in the County
 of Southampton adjoining the lands of Frances Kesley and said Drury
 called Taylor's tract containing by a late survey two hundred and eighteen
 acres the same land which belated to Henry Taylor by the Commissioners
 appointed by Southampton County Court to divide the lands of said
 John Taylor agreeable to his will and which said Henry Taylor hath since
 the division of said land departed this life under the age of twenty one
 years leaving brothers and sisters William Taylor Nancy Fitzhugh and
 Eliza Peterson formerly Nancy Taylor and Eliza Taylor heirs at Law
 each being entitled to one third part of said land to have and to hold
 all the right title and interest the said William Taylor hath in the
 above tract or parcel of land and premises to him the said
 Humphrey Drury his heirs and assigns forever and the said Henry
 Lundy for William Taylor his heirs doth covenant to and with the
 said Humphrey Drury Drury his heirs and assigns that he will
 forever warrant and defend the right title of the said land & premises
 hereby intended to be sold and conveyed to him the said Humphrey
 Drury his heirs and assigns against the claim or claims of all and
 every person or persons whatsoever -
